ADVICE TO CANDIDATES

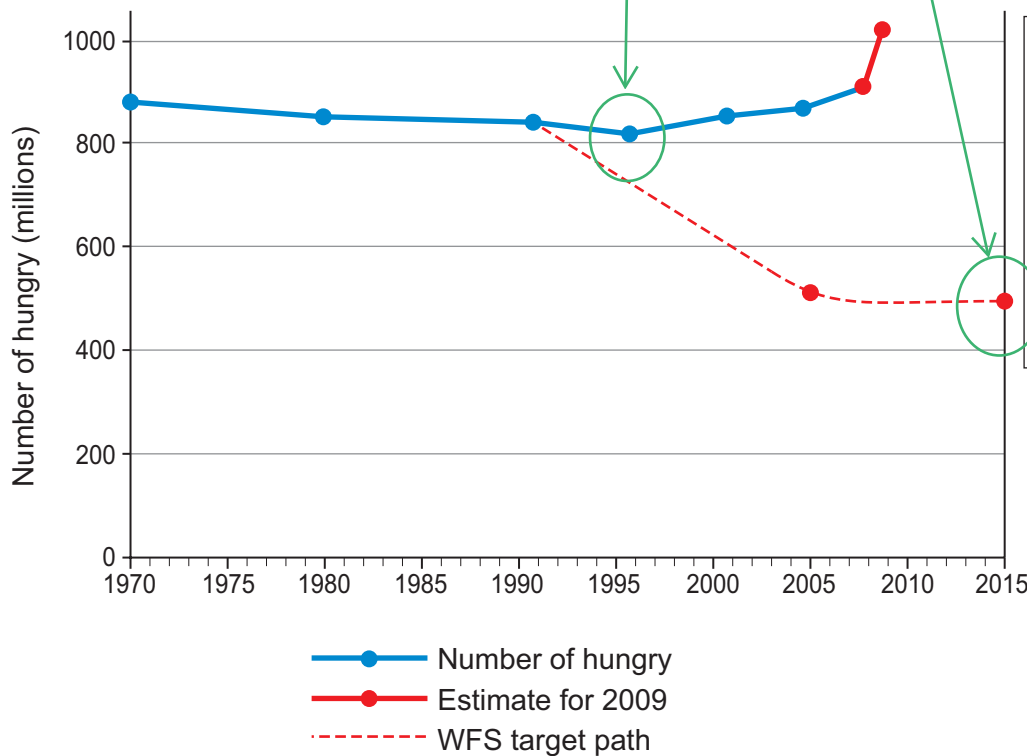

Figure 12: Progress towards reducing number of hungry in the world



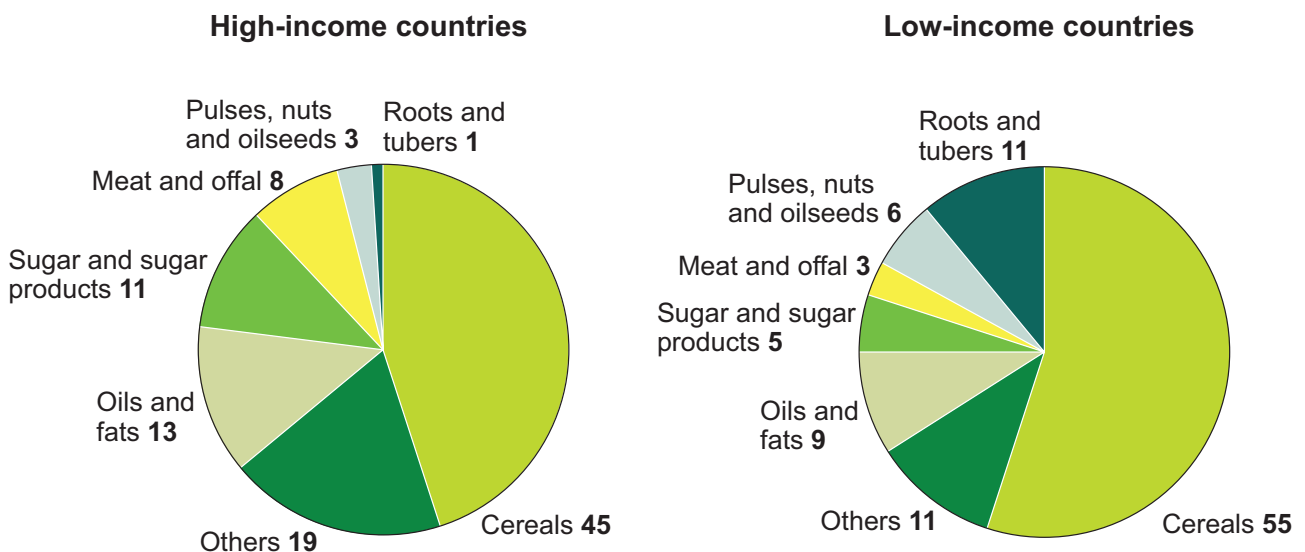
In 2009 a World Food Summit (WFS) was held. ~~The number of hungry up to 2008 was known~~ and an estimate for 2009 given. A target for reducing the number of hungry was set.

The target was set not in 2009 but at the original WFS in 1996. In fact it was a pledge, not just a target. It was reaffirmed by not only the 2009 meeting but by leaders at the 2010 Summit along with other previous summit outcomes.
